


#### Introduction

## From two hours old to the tenth day, we accompanied Wisam in his toughest moments.

Two hours after the birth of baby Wisam at Al-ikhaa Hospital, he developed respiratory distress, which led him to the neonatal intensive care unit where appropriate respiratory support was provided using a CPAP machine. Unfortunately, the baby>s condition continued to deteriorate as he developed left-sided pneumonia along with severe respiratory infection signs and increased pulmonary tension.



#### **Success stories**



A patient successfully resolved her bunion, a condition caused by tight shoes, through a bone surgery at Wasim Husseino Hospital.

Bunions, medically known as «hallux valgus,» are a common foot problem, particularly among women. They result from excessive pressure on the front of the foot, often due to wearing ill-fitting, narrow, or high-heeled shoes. This can lead to swelling, discomfort, and severe pain.

In response to this issue, the patient (H.Q.), a woman in her thirties, sought help at the orthopedic clinic of Wasim Husseino Hospital. She underwent a corrective surgery on the outer side of her big toe, which involved removing the bone protrusions and realigning the bunion>s position. The procedure aimed to alleviate her pain and improve the overall function and appearance of her foot.





Training on psychological first aid for field workers with the presence of representatives from the World Health Organization.

With the presence of representatives from the World Health Organization (WHO), Ms. Adel Heid, Global Mental Health Emergency Director, and Ms. Ghada Zaidan, Technical Lead for Mental Health, SEMA completed the first training session in a series of trainings for healthcare workers on psychological first aid and how to identify and refer individuals with signs of mental disorders in the field.

The training aims to reach 2,200 humanitarian workers in the areas of health, protection, and care, in various regions of northwest Syria, including cities such as Idlib, Azaz, Afrin, Al-Bab, and others.





Al-ikhaa Hospital provides mammography equipment for further advancement in healthcare.

In a significant leap forward in women>s healthcare, the management of Al-ikhaa Hospital, supported by SEMA, introduced mammography imaging equipment. This device represents a major breakthrough in reproductive health, providing ease, accuracy, and convenient access for the accurate diagnosis of breast diseases.




