# Case 101 Around the World: Successful Surgery for a Young Patient with a Rare Medical Condition

A 12-year-old patient visited the vascular surgery clinic at the Idlib Specialized Surgical Hospital, complaining of a mass on the left side of the neck that appears during reading, exertion, and breathing, along with a distinctive hoarseness.

Investigations using ultrasound Doppler and CT scans revealed a rare case of internal jugular vein dilation of more than 5 cm.
