A Mark of Hope... A Medical Breakthrough for the First Time in Northern Syria

Our medical team at the Specialized Surgical Hospital has successfully performed the first-ever aortic coarctation dilation procedure in Northern Syria, saving the life of young Hani and granting him a new chance at a normal, active, and hopeful life.

Hani arrived at our hospital after being referred from another facility, suffering from severe aortic coarctation, which had caused dangerously high blood pressure, persistent fatigue, and intermittent claudication that prevented him from leading a normal life. The only option for securing his health and future was an urgent medical intervention.

With skilled hands and unwavering dedication, our team successfully performed the dilation using a covered stent (Begraft) in the cardiac catheterization lab. Thanks to God, the procedure was a remarkable success!




