# A Journey of Hope: From Kidney Failure to Recovery

Our patient endured years of end-stage renal failure, bravely undergoing repeated dialysis sessions—until relief finally came through a kidney transplant in Turkey. As is well known, the success of a kidney transplant depends on the continued use of immunosuppressive medications that ensure the proper functioning of the transplanted organ.

However, due to the blockade imposed by the former regime on northwestern Syria and the difficulty of regularly accessing medication, the patient was forced to stop her treatment. As a result, her immune system attacked the transplanted kidney, leading once again to kidney failure and a return to frequent dialysis sessions.

# Strengthening the Medical Sector in Southern Rural Idlib
