#### 5 Mobile Clinics... Reaching Those Without

#### **Access to Care**

In areas lacking medical centers, a mobile clinic becomes a true lifeline.

Five mobile clinics have been launched after being fully equipped with medical supplies, heading toward rural Idlib, Hama, Homs, Deir Ezzor, and Damascus – carrying essential healthcare services to the most vulnerable communities.

Each clinic includes a general physician, a midwife, a receptionist, and a data entry staff member. They provide general and women's health consultations, health education, referrals, and free medication distribution.

This project will be implemented in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and health directorates in all targeted Syrian governorates, ensuring that essential healthcare reaches those who cannot access it.

# Ten Years of Absence... and the Pulse of Reunion Returned

Hukm Al-Mohammad, a man from the city of Homs, had spent his sixty years in a silent struggle with loneliness and illness. After being separated from his wife and son, who were martyred in a heavy shelling, he was left without any support. His life ended up in a worn-out tent in the wilderness, surviving the harshness of hard labor under the exploitation of an individual – with no food, no clean water, and not even basic healthcare that preserves human dignity.

Hukm suffered from a painful skin disease (scabies) and severe lower back pain that limited his ability to carry out even the simplest daily tasks. His health had severely deteriorated until SEMA>s case management team identified his situation and received him at the Dar Al-Rafah Home for the Elderly in Idlib, marking the beginning of a new humanitarian journey.
