# Urgent Medical Response from SEMA to the Wildfires in Rural Latakia

In coordination with the Latakia Health Directorate, SEMA has activated its emergency humanitarian response to support those affected by the massive wildfires that swept across several areas in rural Latakia due to the extreme rise in temperatures.

As part of this response, SEMA delivered a shipment of essential medicines and medical supplies to treat burn injuries and cases of suffocation sustained by civilians and civil defense teams during their efforts to combat the fires and save lives.






# Urgent Response by SEMA: Installation of an Oxygen Generator at Al-Shurta Hospital - Harasta

At the request of the Ministry of Health in Damascus, and in coordination with the Idlib Health Directorate, SEMA transported and installed an oxygen generator at Al-Shurta Hospital in Harasta, Rural Damascus, in response to the urgent medical needs witnessed in recent weeks.

This generator will provide continuous refilling of oxygen cylinders within the hospital, thereby strengthening the medical staff's capacity to respond to emergency cases and deliver essential care to patients—especially amidst the growing healthcare demands. For more details...





## SEMA Supports South Syria Response with Life-Saving Medical Equipment

In line with its humanitarian commitment to supporting the Syrian health system, SEMA swiftly implemented an emergency response to the recent events in southern Syria, in coordination with health authorities.

SEMA provided Harasta Police Hospital with a range of essential medical devices, including: a C-arm X-ray machine, ventilators, patient monitoring equipment, surgical tools for urgent interventions, and a sterilization device to ensure infection control.

This initiative reflects SEMA's dedication to saving lives and enhancing the readiness of healthcare facilities to respond promptly to emergency cases.





# Specialized Training Initiative to Enhance Residents¹ Preparedness in Managing Critical Cases

As part of the Homs Recovery Initiative, a pioneering training program was launched to strengthen the capacity of medical residents in handling emergency cases. The program was jointly organized by physicians from MedGlobal and SEMA, in collaboration with the Faculty of Medicine at Homs University - Homs University Hospital, and under the sponsorship of the Homs Doctors Syndicate.

The training targeted internal medicine residents from both Homs University Hospital and Ibn Al-Walid Hospital. It was conducted over two days at the university hospital hall, utilizing advanced teleconferencing and technical equipment to ensure a smooth and highly efficient learning process without disruptions.
