The center aims to provide comprehensive child protection services, including:

Psychosocial support for affected children

Recreational, educational, and interactive activities to enhance their sense of safety and belonging

Family empowerment and awareness on child rights and protection methods

Case monitoring and follow-up, in coordination with relevant authorities
