## Hajj Ahmad...

### A Story of Patience Waiting to Continue

Hajj Ahmad, a 68-year-old man from the city of Salqin, never expected his life to change so quickly. After noticing a decline in his health, he visited a doctor to undergo some tests. The news came as a shock: kidney failure, requiring dialysis sessions three times a week just to stay alive.

Since that day, the Kafr Takharim Dialysis Center, supported by SEMA, has become his lifeline.

There, he receives medical care from a dedicated team that stands by his side throughout a difficult treatment journey, giving him hope to carry on day after day.

Hajj Ahmad says the illness has exhausted him both physically and psychologically, but the presence of this center has eased much of his suffering—especially with the provision of dialysis sessions, medications, and transportation from his home to the center.



## A Preterm Infant's Story: Saved by Neonatal Intensive Care

Baby Anad was born prematurely at 31 weeks of gestation, weighing no more than 1.6 kg, following an emergency cesarean section at one of SEMA's hospitals. From his very first moments, he struggled to survive due to respiratory distress syndrome and rare congenital nasal abnormalities that hindered his ability to breathe normally.

He was immediately admitted to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), where he received meticulous medical care, including mechanical ventilation, specialized treatment, and continuous monitoring. Thanks to the medical team's responsiveness and intensive care, his condition gradually improved until he was able to breathe without support.

After gaining sufficient weight, he underwent a successful surgical procedure in coordination with specialized doctors. One month later, he was discharged from the hospital in stable condition—bringing his family a joy that had not been guaranteed at the beginning.

We are pleased to share these touching moments with you through this video. They are the result of your generosity and support, which has made a real difference in the lives of these children.



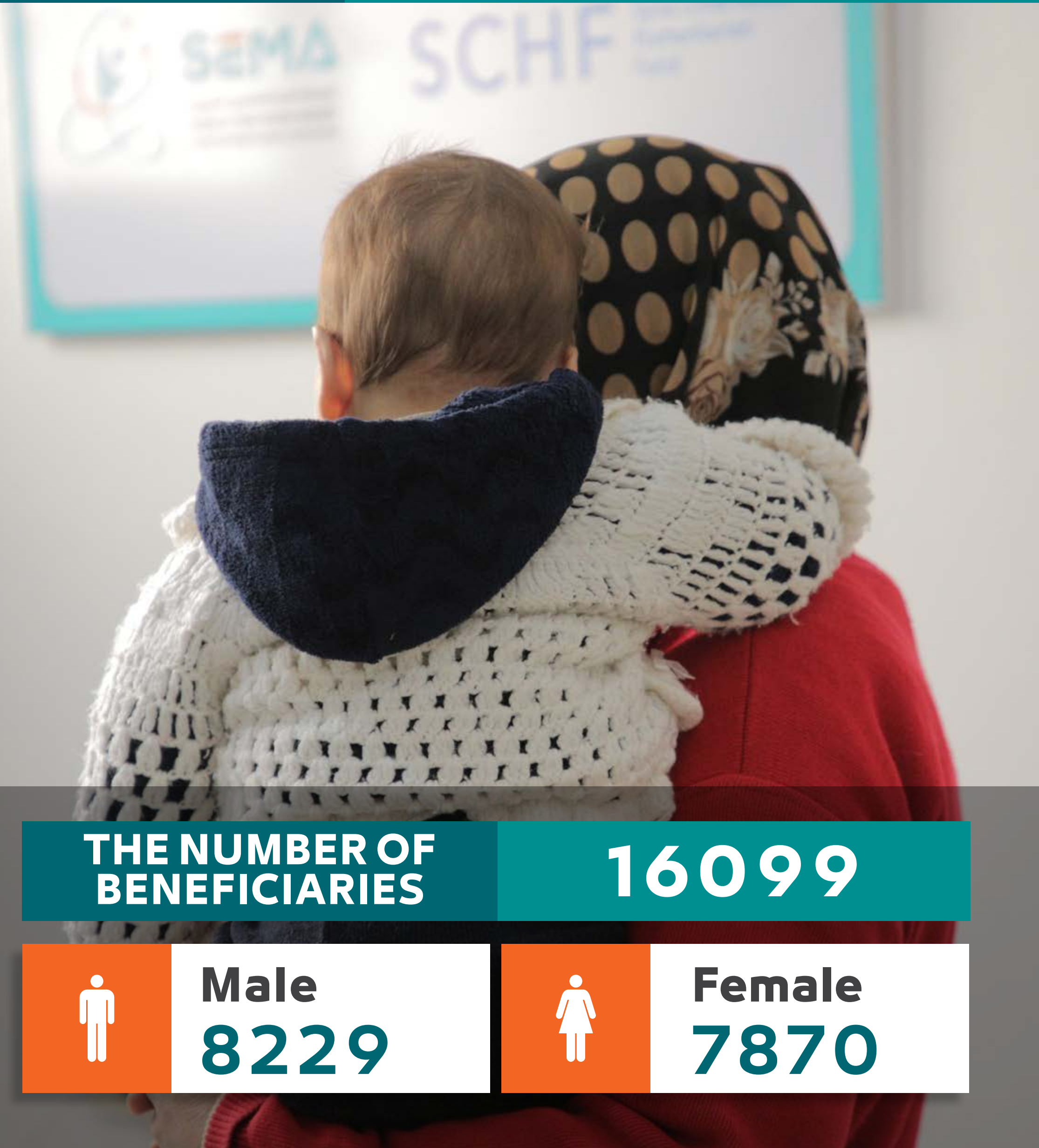
## Eid Reached Those Who Had Been Waiting for It
