## After a Long Journey of Suffering... A Successful Surgery Ends Years of Pain

At the age of fifty-five, this patient never expected his treatment journey to turn into a series of hardships. After undergoing prostate resection surgery at a private hospital, complications began to appear one after another. He developed a stricture in the anterior urethra, which required two consecutive procedures, yet the narrowing returned for a third time, making his condition increasingly complex.

As his health deteriorated, he found himself unable to afford further surgeries at private hospitals, caught between the pain of illness and financial hardship. At that point, he turned to Al Rahma Hospital in Darkoush.

Following a thorough medical evaluation, the surgical team performed a procedure to repair the posterior urethral injury. The operation was successful, and the urinary catheter was removed, allowing the patient to urinate normally again and regain an important part of his comfort and dignity.

Expressing his gratitude, the patient said:

“After the surgery at the private hospital, I was unable to urinate, and I could no longer afford the cost of further treatment. I turned to Al Rahma Hospital, where I found care and attention. Thank God, the surgery was successful, and I was able to return to my normal life.”



## IRC Delegation Visits the Specialized Surgical Hospital

The Specialized Surgical Hospital in Idlib welcomed a delegation from the International Rescue Committee (IRC) as part of a field visit aimed at reviewing the medical services provided and the mechanisms of their implementation. The delegation was received by members of SEMA's administrative staff alongside the hospital management team.

The visit included a tour of the hospital's various departments and facilities, where the delegation was introduced to the nature of the services provided and discussed the most pressing needs. They also reviewed the workflow and potential challenges in order to contribute to enhancing service quality and addressing any obstacles.

During the visit, Ms. Itizaz Youssef, Country Director of the International Rescue Committee in Syria, expressed her appreciation for the level of services provided, noting that operations are being carried out with high efficiency and that the hospital delivers distinguished medical care.

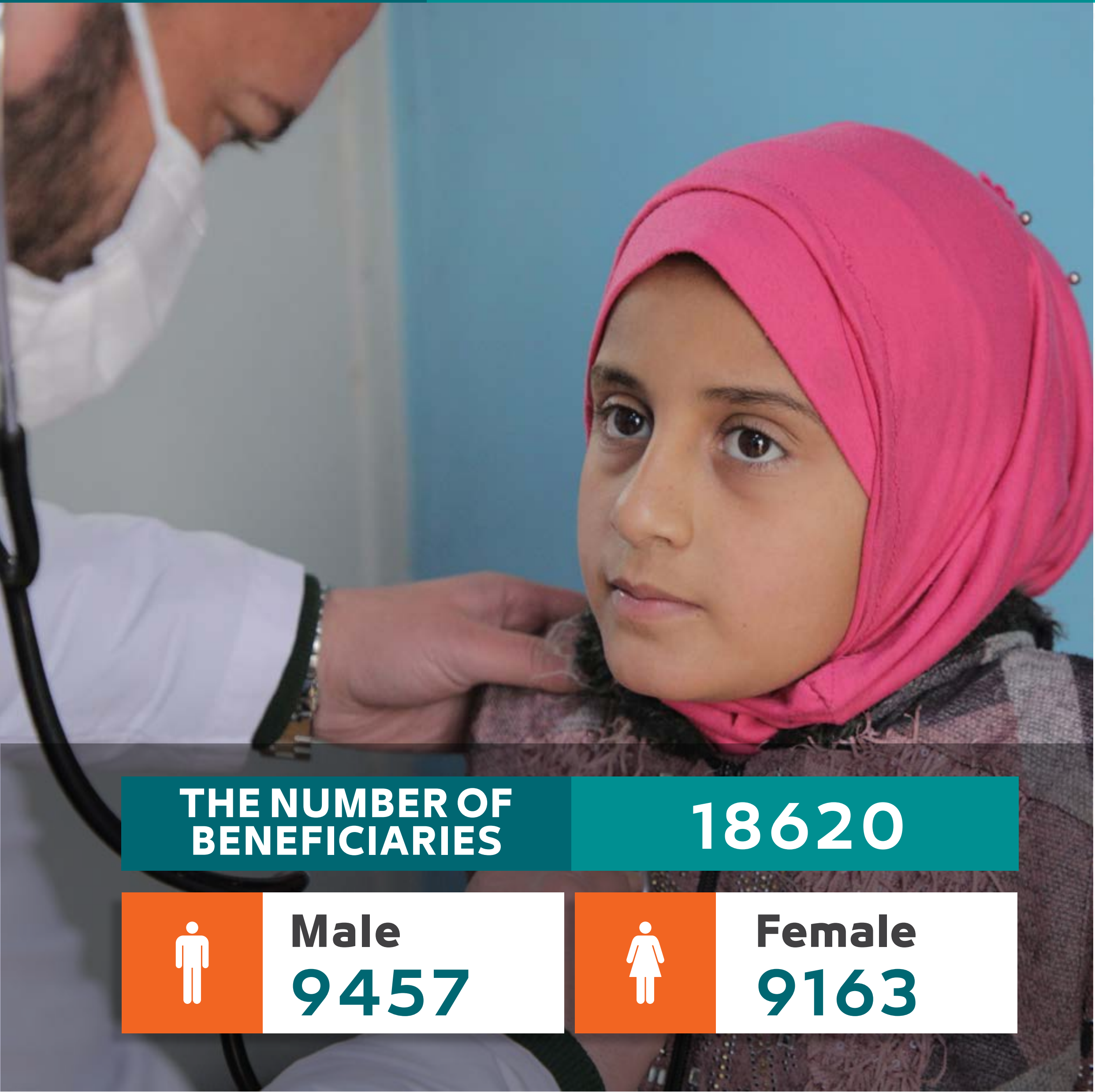


## Opening of Al Durra Park in Ariha to Promote Safe Spaces for Children

The Ariha Community Center, affiliated with SEMA, in collaboration with the Ariha Community Committee, officially inaugurated Al Durra Park following the completion of rehabilitation and preparation works. This initiative aims to provide a safe and recreational environment for children in the city, while also raising awareness about the dangers of war remnants.

The rehabilitation works included equipping the playground area with safe equipment suitable for different age groups, in addition to implementing infrastructure improvements such as extending the electricity network and rehabilitating sanitation facilities to ensure their readiness for use. Awareness activities were also carried out through child-friendly drawings, alongside the distribution of informational brochures throughout the park.

The opening event was attended by 80 children in an interactive atmosphere that reflected the importance of this space as a safe and supportive environment for children.

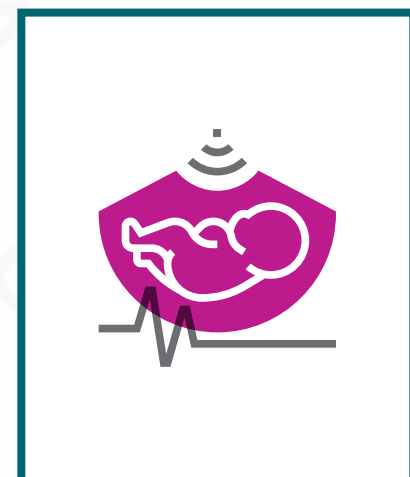





